Long-standing Councillors stand down



After serving as a Willaston Parish Councillor for 43 years, Maurice Jones stood down from the Parish Council at the election in May. Maurice had served as Chairman since 2011 and had held the position on several previous occasions. He also served for many years on Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council.

Willaston is very grateful for so many years of hard work from Maurice, supported by his wife Ann, who in recent years also served on the Parish Council.

At the Parish Civic Service earlier this year, Maurice was presented with a Parish Council plague, a certificate of

long service and an engraved tankard.



John Flackett also stood down after 15 years on the Parish Council. We are grateful for his dedication which included the organisation of the Rose Queen event and involvement in Willaston in Bloom.

Anti-social behaviour on the playing field

There have been multiple incidents of vandalism and anti-social behaviour reported over the summer on the Lettie Spencer Playing Field on Wybunbury Road. These have included graffiti, litter including broken glass on the children's play area, breaking off branches and removing bark to damage trees. As a result the playing field is now locked at night and has also been closed for short periods. The playing fields are owned by Willaston Parish Council who have been working with local Police to try to stop this behaviour.



At the end of July the Police brought their panna football game to the playing field for those aged 10-16.

Moorfields Development Update

Residents local to this development (also known as Bayley Croft) are still having to cope with extreme noise and disruption, including what feels like a mini earthquake at times.

We have been promised that noisy generators, which have been running throughout the night for many weeks, are to be switched off once essential drainage work is completed.

Cheshire East is keeping a close eye on the development with officers from planning and environmental health departments making frequent site visits.

Work is scheduled for completion in October 2021.

Your biggest issues - Speeding, Parking & Dog Fouling

The most common issues brought to the Parish Council continue to be:

Speeding – A small minority continue to speed through the village. Please slow down so avoidable accidents don't happen.

Parking – Our village pavements are very narrow in places, so parking on both pavements and grass verges sometimes means that wheelchairs and pushchairs or pedestrians cannot pass without moving into the road. Please park considerately.

Dog Fouling – Most owners clean up after their pets but a few still don't.

Dogs let loose on the playing field and other green spaces, such as the Maze, not only make an unpleasant mess but provide a health risk to our children.
